On December 2, 1991, I examined a multicolored child's nightshirt for semen or other physiological fluid stains. I performed a visual examination with both normal room light and short- and long-wavelength ultraviolet light. This visual examination did not reveal any physiological fluid stains. The condition of the garment was consistent with it being freshly laundered. Because no stained areas could be identified, no chemical tests for semen or other physiological fluids were carried out.
